Bolderwood Deer Sanctuary Walk

This circular walk takes you through ancient woodlands to the Bolderwood Deer Sanctuary, where you can often spot deer grazing. The path is well-marked and suitable for families, offering picturesque views and the tranquillity of the forest.

Day Exploring

Exbury Gardens & Steam Railway


